Jo: Hello and welcome to On the Town from BBC Learning English. I'm Jo and

with me is Feifei.

few big cities in China, but this is the first time to Xi'an. You are from Xi'an, so tell me - lots of people say it's very different from other cities in

Obviously lots of places in China seem to be rushing for glass and steel high rise buildings, but Xi'an is still trying to retain its charm and its Chinese character and traditions.

Jo: Richard says you get the modern aspects of Xi'an and the traditional, older

parts of Xi'an.

Feifei: Modern 现代的, aspects 方面, 样子。Richard 说你可以看到西安不仅有现代的一

Jo: He says the older parts of Xi'an sit cheek by jowl, next to each other.

Feifei: Glass and steel high rise buildings 玻璃钢筋造就的高楼大厦。

Jo: But Xi'an is still trying to retain its charm and its Chinese character and

traditions.

Feifei: To retain 保持,保留。Chinese character and traditions 中国的特色和传统。So

invaders.

Feifei: Guard 守卫; invader 侵略者。

Jo: It sounds like there's a lot to see in Xi'an, but we are only going there for

two days!

Feifei: I know! But Richard is going to tell us what he thinks is worth seeing in a

day.

Jo: Here are some words and expressions that he uses. The Terracotta

Warriors.

Feifei: 兵马俑 the Terracotta Warriors.

Jo: Muslim Quarter.

Feifei: 回民街。

Jo: Back alleys.

Feifei: 小胡同,小巷子 back alley.



Jo: Eaves.

Feifei: 屋檐,房檐。

Jo: Crafts.

Feifei: 手工艺品。

Jo: Paintings.

Feifei: 水彩画,油画。

Jo: Calligraphy.

Feifei: 书法。

Jo: Sub or micro-environment.

Feifei: 小的或是微小的环境 sub or micro-environment. Let's listen.
