William: It's not nice, I'm sorry, I'm sorry. Now, we can also use this word iffy

when we are describing something that is uncertain, that might not

happen. So let's hear an example of that.

Example

A: Are you still planning to move house this year?

B: Well, that's looking a bit iffy to be honest. It depends on Richard's job.
