Vicki: Hi and welcome to BBC Learning English. I'm Vicki.

Chen Li: 大家好,我是陈鹂。

Vicki: Today we're talking about karaoke.

Vicki: Yes, it is quite popular and getting more popular; but it's quite

different here from in Asia.

Vicki: As you probably know, karaoke began in Japan, and has spread across

Chen Li: Doing your best 尽力而为。

Even if you can't sing, at least you can give it a try. Karaoke provides you the chance to give it a try, to do your best. That is what is really behind the popularity of karaoke.

Chen Li: 她还使用了一个习语。

Vicki: Give it a try.

Chen Li: 试一试,每个人都可以尝试一下。

Vicki: But in Britain, karaoke is seen rather differently. Here's Dick Hobbs, a

Professor of Sociology.

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I mean the karaoke that I've been used to, is Friday night in a pub, where someone would turn the machine on and people would go up and sing as badly as they wanted to and it was about screaming and bawling.

Vicki: So, they all agree that in the UK, karaoke is much less serious than in

Asia. It's about having a laugh.

Vicki: Well, in today's programme we're talking about karaoke in the UK.

Until recently, karaoke was usually done in pubs with an open mike.

Chen Li: An open mike 也就是说在酒吧的任何一个人都可以来唱首歌。

Vicki: But recently, modern karaoke bars have opened up, with private

booths for hire, similar to the ones in Asia.

Chen Li: Private booth 私人包房,可以租给个人和朋友一起唱卡拉 OK 自娱自乐。

Vicki: I asked two of my colleagues here at BBC Learning English what they

thought about karaoke. Here's Jo.

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I love karaoke. I don't enjoy karaoke in front of a big pub, singing in front of other people; that's quite embarrassing. But if you're just with your friends, in a small room, drinking beers; be with your friends, lose all your inhibitions, having fun, singing your heart out to all your favourite songs, and just have a really fun, mad time. I just absolutely love it.



Chen Li: 看来 Jo 是非常喜欢唱卡拉 OK。

Vicki: She said it was a good way to let go of your inhibitions.

Chen Li: Inhibitions 压抑的情绪, Jo 发现卡拉 OK 是个放松的好方法,而不用担心他人

怎么看。

Vicki: Jo thinks it's great fun to spend an evening singing your heart out with

some friends.

Chen Li: Singing your heart out 放声高歌, 投入所有的热情和精力。

Vicki: But, like a lot of British people, does Jo need to be drunk to sing

karaoke?

I don't need to be really drunk, just a couple of beers to kind of loosen me up a little bit, get me in the mood as it were.

Chen Li: Jo 说她不需要一定要喝醉了酒才去唱卡拉 OK。

Vicki: But she does prefer to have one or two drinks first. Here's another

colleague.

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Karaoke to me just sounds absolutely awful. I could never imagine doing it myself. It's just too embarrassing. Listening to people who can't sing doing karaoke is just cringeworthy. You know I'd rather sit in a quiet pub and have a few drinks.

Chen Li: 他认为卡拉 OK 真是太糟糕了。

Vicki: He'd never do it because it's just too embarrassing.

Chen Li: Embarrassing 让人难为情的。

Vicki: He thinks that when people who can't sing do karaoke it's

cringeworthy.

Chen Li: Cringeworthy 意思是避而远之,让人感到不安惶恐。

Vicki: He'd rather go to a quiet pub.

Chen Li: 那么 Vicki 你的看法是什么呢? 你喜欢唱卡拉 OK?

Vicki: Yes, I like it a lot. I think it's really fun, and I don't get embarrassed

because I can sing reasonably well.

Chen Li: 好了,关于英国人对卡拉 OK 的看法和亚洲人有什么差异这个话题,我们就说到这

Vicki: Bye!
